

gether the first annual Creative Edge Film Festival (CEFF) with the collaboration of executive producers Ginger and Jim Belilove and main sponsor Creative Edge Master Shop. On September 25, 26 and 27, the Orpheum Theater will be screening the documentaries, narratives, music video, and a surprise short not to be missed by animal lovers.

"It's a showcase and a forum for films that are quirky, thoughtprovoking, and entertaining. We are trying to create the reputation that we bring good, inspiring, quality films," explains Jim. CEFF is focusing on uplifting films.

Jim describes the festival as a way to showcase Fairfield's talent. Most of the films have some connection to Fairfield. World Fair is a short documentary directed by Amanda Murray about the 1939 New York World's Fair, as told by fairgoers now in their 80's and 90's. Amanda is coowner of the production company Wicked Delicate, which also includes her husband Ian Cheney from King Corn. Ian Cheney's documentary, The Search for General Tso, is a full-length documentary exploring the origins of the popular Chinese-American dish, Tso Chicken. But as Jim, Ian's uncle says, "It's more of a

all. As Tracy said, "I told Jim about Soleri's film and said we should have a screening in Fairfield. That led to the idea of a film festival." Tracy was good friends with Soleri for the last decade of his life. Narrated by actor-activist Peter Coyote, the film shows Soleri's futuristic architectural designs and creations in Arcosanti, Arizona, which have earned him a following that continues to grow even after his recent death. Director Aimee Madison will be available for Q&A after the shows.

Several works will be on the schedule every night in addition to the featured films. This includes: a music video, Mysteries of Love – featuring the theme song from 'Blue Velvet', vocals by Kid Moxie, and music by Angelo Badalamenti and

Connecting Suicide to Substance Abuse/Addiction Sept 10 at FPL

The public is invited to attend Connecting Suicide to Substance Abuse/Addiction, a lecture, film and Q&A session this Thursday, Sept. 10, 7 p.m. at the Fairfield Public Library. Presented by FairfieldCares, a Fairfield/Jefferson County Suicide Prevention coalition and cosponsored by the Fairfield/Jefferson County Mental Health Alliance.

The event explores how substance abuse and addiction intertwines with suicide. The strongest predictor of suicide is alcoholism, not a psychiatric diagnosis. People with drug addictions are about six times more likely to commit suicide than the general population.

Featured speaker Brian Simmons is a Licensed Independent Social Worker and International Alcohol and Drug Counselor (IADC). He works for Iowa Counseling Service through the River Hills Medical Behavioral Health Center in Ottumwa.

The event begins with a brief film at 7 p.m. Bridging Addiction and Suicide by Raymond Dalton. Cathleen Casey and Rob Hubler, co-directors of FairfieldCares, and Mayor Ed Malloy will speak before Brian Simmons. Q&A session follows. All are welcome.



Last year, FAA initiated a new award to recognize random acts of creativity in the community. It happens when a person, business or organization goes beyond the norm and puts together something that stands out creatively. This something can be temporary or permanent, whimsical, thought provoking, or just makes you smile. Of course it is awarded randomly.

Health and Wholeness, on the block north of the Fairfield Square on Main Street, always has beautiful windows that draw you in to take a closer look. The attention to detail, color and creativity is an example of great window dressing.
